



# MARINES IN KOREA



Moving to attack, a corporal leads his automatic-rifleman through a rice paddy, disregarding the dead enemy soldier underfoot.




Marines of the 1st Provisional Marine Brigade board trains that will take them to the battle front of the Naktong River.

## PUSAN PERIMETER

AUGUST 1950: Although initially requested by General MacArthur for his planned amphibious landing at Inchon, the quickly assembled Marines of the 1st Provisional Marine Brigade and Marine Aircraft Group 33 first saw action in the Pusan Perimeter where the battered forces of the U.S. Army and South Korea were under heavy assault from fourteen divisions of the North Korean People's Army.
