Uniformed Victim Advocate (UVA): 623-7770 Cell: 090-6861-5008

The UVA provides essential support and care to the victim to include providing information on available options and resources to assist the victim in making informed decisions as they progress through resolution and healing. The UVAs maintain communications and contact with the victim as needed for continued victim support. The UVA advises the victim of the two possible types of reports:

- **Restricted Report:** Confidential with no Command or Law Enforcement notification; allows for more time to consider all possible options and can receive medical attention without triggering an investigation
- **Unrestricted Report:** Command is notified so that an investigation can be initiated; can receive medical treatment, advocacy and counseling

Sexual Assault Response Coordinator (SARC): 623-7198 Cell: 090-2768-2681

The SARC is considered the center of gravity when it comes to ensuring that victims of sexual assault receive appropriate and responsive care. They serve as the single point of contact to coordinate sexual assault victim care.

PLEASE BE SURE TO SPEAK TO A UVA OR SARC BEFORE YOU CONTACT LAW ENFORCEMENT OR YOUR COMMAND. Once you inform law enforcement officials or a representative from your command, a restricted report is no longer an option.

Although you may understandably feel frightened or embarrassed, please do not allow those feelings to influence your decision to report the crime. Remember, this is a crime against the victim, and the victim is not to blame – the perpetrator is!
