

## Travel Requirements During COVID-19

Travel directly or indirectly funded by the government requires a waiver if any

portion of the trip includes a restricted location.

- For ALL TRAVEL, commanders, waiver exemption authorities, and travelers must adhere to all federal, state and local rules, including testing and restriction of movement (ROM) requirements, if applicable.
- **Personal** (non-government-funded) travel (authorized leave outside local area not directly or indirectly related to official travel) **is exempt from location-based waiver requirements**. (Leave outside the local area requires approval from the Marine's unit commander or civilian equivalent typically O-5 and above).
- **Government-funded** travel for any purpose other than those listed in the exemptions sidebar, including any authorized leave outside the local area that is directly or indirectly related to official travel, **is subject to location restrictions.** 
  - Example 1: Funded Environmental Morale Leave (FEML) and Consecutive Overseas Tour (COT) leave is directly related to official travel; travel restrictions apply.
  - Example 2: Leave in conjunction with duty travel (including PCS travel or TDY) is indirectly related to official travel; travel restrictions apply.
- Travel to, from, or through restricted locations requires a waiver which must be approved by an appropriate officer in the grade of **O-6 or civilian equivalent.**
- For PCS travel, waivers must be coordinated between the gaining and losing organizations.

## **Exemptions**

- 1. Travel associated with uniformed personnel recruiting and accessions activities, to include accessions, basic training, advanced military individual training, and follow-on travel to the first duty station.
- 2. Travel by patients for purposes of medical treatment.
- 3. Travel for deployment or operational activities.
- 4. Joint Force travel authorized by the Commander, US TRANSCOM.
- 5. Travel by personnel pending retirement or separation.
- 6. Travel to and from professional military education.
- 7. Travel for formal, entry-level civilian accessions programs.
- 8. Travel by civilian employees complying with overseas tour rotation agreement requirements.
