1. Purpose. To provide a list of aviation awards, eligibility criteria and submission procedures for award nominations.

2. Cancellation. MCO 1650.29G.

3. Summary of Revisions. Addition of two MCAA awards, four aviation related awards and change in eligibility and submission criteria for several existing aviation awards has necessitated a revision to the current order.

4. Information. Enclosures (1) through (4) provide pertinent information on aviation awards sponsored by military and civilian agencies, including a brief history, eligibility criteria, nomination dates and selection procedures for each award. Nominations shall be submitted in accordance with the guidance defined in this Order.

5. Action

a. Organizations with personnel or units that meet the criteria contained in enclosures (1) through (4) are encouraged to submit nominations.

b. Nominations, plus one copy, shall be submitted via the endorsing chain of command to Commandant of the Marine Corps ((CMC) (Code ASM)).

c. Nominations must be received by CMC (ASM) on or before the due date detailed in the relevant enclosures. Modifications to due dates, if required, will be indicated in the annual CMC message which solicits award nominations. Late or incomplete nominations will not normally be considered.

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d. Individual award nomination packages shall include:

(1) a concise, comprehensive description of action(s) not to exceed two pages;

(2) a biography of the individual;

(3) a proposed citation;

(4) two 8"x10" current color portrait photographs of the nominee in the Service "A" uniform and three 8"x10" color or black and white photographs of the nominee in his/her working environment; and

(5) a CD copy of each package to include photos in a high resolution JPEG format.

e. Unit award nomination packages shall contain:

(1) a concise description of action(s) not to exceed three pages;

(2) a unit history;

(3) a proposed citation;

(4) current photographs (including at least five 8" x 10" color photographs appropriate to the unit's mission);

(5) supporting documentation which shall include a completed copy of the appropriate Statistical Summary contained in enclosure (5); and

(6) a CD copy of each package to include photos in a hi-res JPEG format.

f. Nominations for acts of valor or notable achievements should be submitted to the appropriate major command as soon as possible after the event. The major command shall review the eligibility of the award nominations from the subordinate units.

g. Each major command may submit only one nomination for each award and must include a point of contact for each award submission.

6. Responsibilities

a. CMC. CMC (ASM) is responsible for coordinating Marine Corps participation in all aviation award selections and those ceremonies conducted by the Marine Corps Aviation Association (MCAA). CMC (ASM) will publish the annual Marine Administrative Message (MARADMIN) for MCAA awards.

b. Director of Air Warfare. The Navy's Director of Air Warfare is responsible for the drafting of the annual message and coordinating aviation award selections for the Association of Naval Aviation (ANA) awards.

c. American Helicopter Society (AHS). Nominations are solicited via AHS membership or corporate sponsors. Additional information can be obtained via the AHS website, www.vtol.org.

d. Local Commanders


(1) Local commanders shall provide Temporary Additional Duty (TAD) orders and travel/per diem funding for aviation individual award recipients incidental to participation in award ceremonies. Every effort shall be made to ensure the presence of the award recipient(s) at those ceremonies.

(2) Local commanders shall provide TAD orders and travel/per diem funding for the commanding officer (or his/her designated representative) of an award winning unit.

(3) Local commanders shall provide TAD orders and travel/per diem funding for individuals (other than CMC representatives) who attend presentations in an official capacity; (e.g., speakers, panel members, etc.).

(4) Individuals, other than those described in paragraphs 6/d/1 through 3 above, who desire to attend award ceremonies, must do so at their own expense.

(5) Local commanders are encouraged to recognize individual and unit recipients at appropriate local ceremonies.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/OFFICER

NAME: ROBERT GUY ROBINSON AWARD
-MARINE NAVAL FLIGHT OFFICER OF THE YEAR

AWARD SPONSOR: Northrop Grumman Aerospace Systems

HISTORY: Established in memory of First Lieutenant Robert Guy Robinson, WWI Medal of Honor recipient and pioneer in the Naval Flight Officer Field. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the Marine Naval Flight Officer of the Year.

ELIGIBILITY: All Marine Naval Flight Officers, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine Aviation in combat, research and development, weapons employment or overall performance in Marine Aviation. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

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CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/OFFICER

NAME: EARLE HATTAWAY AWARD
-MARINE AVIATION GROUND OFFICER OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Rolls Royce North America, Inc.

HISTORY: Established in honor of Lieutenant Colonel Hattaway whose exceptional professionalism and technical skill as an Aircraft Maintenance Officer earned him the recognition as the first Marine Aviation Ground Officer of the Year. CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine Aviation in combat, research and development, weapons employment or overall performance in Marine Aviation. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/OFFICER

NAME: ROBERT F. GIBSON AWARD
-MARINE AVIATION COMMAND AND CONTROL
OFFICER OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Northrop Grumman Electronic Systems

HISTORY: Established in honor of Colonel Robert F. Gibson who, during his 30 plus year career, was responsible for the development of a combat readiness evaluation of the Marine Command and Control System. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the Marine Aviation Command and Control Officer of the year.

ELIGIBILITY: Any officer serving in Marine Aviation Command and Control billet, Regular or Reserve possessing MOS's 06XX/28XX/59XX/72XX.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine Aviation by an officer serving in a MACCS billet possessing the MOS's 06XX/28XX/59XX/72XX. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/OFFICER

NAME: SILVER HAWK AWARD

SPONSOR: The Boeing Company

HISTORY: Established in honor of and to recognize the active duty Marine Aviator or Naval Flight Officer who holds the earliest Naval Aviation designation date.

ELIGIBILITY: The active duty Marine Aviator or Marine Naval Flight Officer with the most senior date of designation.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The award is reserved for the officer whose date of designation precedes that of any other Marine Aviator or Marine Naval Flight Officer (NFO).

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: The determination is made by CMC based on the earliest date of designation as an Aviator or NFO and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Nomination is not required. CMC will maintain the precedence list of prospective Silver Hawks.

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: DANNY L. RADISH AWARD
-MARINE ENLISTED AIRCREW OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: BAE Systems, Platform Solutions

HISTORY: Established in honor of Master Gunnery Sergeant Radish who served with honor, distinction and heroism in Marine Aviation for over 20 years. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the Marine Enlisted Aircrew member of the year.

ELIGIBILITY: Any enlisted aircrew member from either fixed wing, rotary wing or tiltrotor communities, including unmanned aerial vehicle operators, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine Aviation by an enlisted aircrew member. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

NAME: WILLIE D. SPROULE AWARD
-AVIATION MAINTENANCE MARINE OF THE YEAR

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: KENNETH W. SOUTHCOMB AWARD
-AVIATION SUPPLY MARINE AIRCREW OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Elbit Systems of America, LLC.

HISTORY: Established in honor of Master Gunnery Sergeant Southcomb who served with honor and distinction in Marine Aviation for over 30 years, and in that time held every position in aviation supply from warehouseman to noncommissioned officer in charge. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the Aviation Supply Marine of the year.

ELIGIBILITY: Any enlisted Marine possessing the MOS 66XX, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine aviation by an enlisted Marine possessing the MOS 66XX, serving in an aviation supply billet. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: PAUL G. VESS AWARD
-AVIONICS MARINE OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: BAE Systems, Electronics Solutions

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: GAINES B. GILBERT AWARD
-AVIATION ORDNANCE MARINE OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Raytheon

HISTORY: Established in honor of Master Gunnery Sergeant Gilbert who served with honor, distinction and heroism in Marine Aviation for 39 years. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the Aviation Ordnance Marine of the year.

ELIGIBILITY: Any enlisted Marine possessing the MOS 65XX, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding contribution to Marine aviation by an enlisted Ordnanceman, possessing the MOS 65XX. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

NAME: KENNETH A. INNIS AWARD
-AVIATION COMMAND AND CONTROL MARINE OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Lockheed Martin

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: JACK W. DEMMOND AWARD
-AVIATION GROUND MARINE OF THE YEAR

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/ENLISTED

NAME: JAMES E. NICHOLSON AWARD
-NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICER LEADERSHIP AWARD

SPONSOR: Raytheon

HISTORY: Established in honor of James Nicholson, who was a member of the First Aeronautic Company; the first American aviation unit completely trained and fully equipped to be sent overseas in World War I. CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most significant example of leadership demonstrated by a NCO or SNCO Marine over an extended period such as a deployment. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL OR UNIT

NAME: JAMES MAGUIRE AWARD
-EXCEPTIONAL ACHIEVEMENT

SPONSOR: BAE Systems, Electronic Solutions

HISTORY: Established in memory of Gunnery Sergeant Maguire, the first enlisted Marine ordered to the Annapolis Aviation Camp on aviation duty. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of the recipient of the Exceptional Achievement Award.

ELIGIBILITY: Any Marine or unit of Marine Aviation, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most significant contribution to, or professional achievement in Marine aviation not otherwise recognized by an MCAA award. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

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CATEGORY: MCAA/INDIVIDUAL/OFFICER/ENLISTED

NAME: THE COMMANDANT'S ACQUISITIONS TROPHY
-THE COMMANDANT'S AWARD FOR ACQUISITION
EXCELLENCE

SPONSOR: FLIR Systems, Inc.

HISTORY: Established in 2007 to recognize excellence
and superior achievement in the Acquisition
Field.

ELIGIBILITY: Any Marine, Regular or Reserve, to include
PMA serving in field.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most significant contribution to, or
professional achievement in Marine aviation
acquisition not otherwise recognized by an
MCAA national award. The award covers the
period from 1 January through 31 December
immediately preceding the nomination
period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection is made by CMC Aviation Awards
Board and presented at the annual MCAA
Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/UNIT

NAME: ROBERT M. HANSON AWARD
-MARINE FIGHTER/ATTACK SQUADRON OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: The Boeing Company

HISTORY: Established in memory of Captain Hanson, Marine Aviator, fighter ace, and Medal of Honor winner, killed in World War II after shooting down 25 enemy aircraft. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of a Marine fighter/attack squadron.

ELIGIBILITY: All F/A-18A/C/D squadrons, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding Marine fighter/attack squadron. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

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CATEGORY: MCAA/UNIT

NAME: LAWSON H. M. SANDERSON AWARD
-MARINE ATTACK SQUADRON OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: BAE Systems, Electronics, Intelligence and Support.

HISTORY: Established in honor of Major General Sanderson who served Marine aviation with honor and distinction from 1917 to 1951. Awarded to recognize the superior performance of a Marine attack squadron.

ELIGIBILITY: All AV-8B squadrons, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding Marine attack squadron. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

CATEGORY: MCAA/UNIT

NAME: ROYAL N. MOORE AWARD
-MARINE TACTICAL ELECTRONIC WAREFARE
SQUADRON OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Northrop Grumman Aerospace Systems

HISTORY: Established in memory of Major General Moore who served Marine aviation for 39 years, and is known for his actions that directly advanced the electronic warfare capabilities. Awarded to recognize the most outstanding Marine electronic warfare squadron.

ELIGIBILITY: All Marine EA-6B squadrons, Regular or Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding Marine Tactical Electronic Warfare Squadron. The award covers the period from 1 January through 31 December immediately preceding the nomination period.

SELECTION/PRESENTATION: Selection made by CMC Aviation Awards Board and presented at the annual MCAA Reunion and Symposium.

NOMINATION DUE DATE: Due 1 February to CMC (ASM).

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CATEGORY: MCAA/UNIT

NAME: HENRY WILDFANG AWARD
-MARINE AERIAL REFUELER TRANSPORT SQUADRON
OF THE YEAR

SPONSOR: Lockheed Martin

HISTORY: Established in honor of Major Wildfang,
whose contributions as a pilot in the
Marine Transport community spanned nearly
four decades. Awarded to recognize the
superior performance of a Marine Aerial
Refueler Transport Squadron.

ELIGIBILITY: All Marine KC-130 squadrons, Regular or
Reserve.

CRITERIA AND PERIOD: The most outstanding Marine Aerial Refueler
Transport Squadron. The award covers the
period from 1 January through 31 December
immediately preceding the nomination
period.
